The course comprises of three independent, progressive modules, each building in complexity. Participants may take a single module or progress through all three.

Module 1 - Paediatric Nutrition for Life

Module 1 provides an introduction to paediatric dietetics and gives participants a working knowledge and experience of evidence-based practice in the areas of growth, nutrition assessment, infant feeding and common childhood issues such as obesity and faltering growth.

Module 1 is suitable for:

- Student dietitians or health professionals
- Dietitians with no or limited paediatric experience
- GPs and other medical officers with a special interest in paediatrics
- Child health professionals including nursing and allied health professionals.



Module 2 - Paediatric Nutrition for Disease



Module 2 offers a very comprehensive and practical course for dietitians and medical staff looking to extend their existing knowledge of paediatric dietetics in the areas of allergy, cystic fibrosis, malnutrition and nutrition support.

Module 2 is suitable for:

- Dietitians who have completed Module 1 and have limited paediatric or no experience
- Dietitians who have not completed Module 1 but have paediatric dietetic experience
- GPs and other medical officers including medical students (would recommend completing Module 1 prior).

Module 3 - Introduction to Advanced Paediatric Nutrition Areas

Module 3 offers experienced dietitians and medical officers an opportunity to update and enhance their knowledge base in specialty paediatric areas such as critical care, neonatal nutrition, metabolic medicine, parenteral nutrition and the ketogenic diet. Alternatively, it can offer dietitians aiming to work in a tertiary setting an in-depth theoretical and practical foundation for future clinical work.

Module 3 is suitable for:

- Dietitians who have completed Modules 1 and 2 and are not working in paediatrics
- Dietitians who have previous experience in paediatrics and have not completed Module 1 and 2
- GPs and other medical officers including medical students (would recommend completing Module 1 and 2 prior).
